We recommend Tave!

If you don't have a client management system yet, it's time to invest in one. We've been using **Tave** for years and love it. There are quite a few other services but Tave is our tried, trusted and true one. Tave keeps track of EVERYTHING related to our clients & business, (okay, it doesn't keep track of mileage, yet... but we're hoping it does real soon!)

THREE.

A fast program to cull photos

We recommend Photo Mechanic!

We use this to cull our wedding and potrait photos and it is SO much faster than lightroom. It is worth every penny and more! You can even try it free for 30 days.

FOUR.

Albums made easy

We recommend Smart Albums!

Made album design simple, easy & fun. Yes, fun. We pay for the full subscription to have the ability to send our client's proofs which makes proofing so easy!

We've been able to easily add albums to our collections and not stress about when clients do purchase one because creating a proof now takes less than an hour!

FIVE.

Create presets

We created our own film presets as our base for all of our edits & tweak them a little here and there to find what works for us. Presets help keep your work consistent and save you time with editing. If you don't want to use someone else's presets, you can you-tube tutorials on how to make your own

Pick a great storefront

We recommend Pixieset!

We use this to share our images & sell prints through their easy storefront. There are many other sharing sites available but pixie set was super intuitive for us and presented our images in a beautiful and minimalist way.

Make blogging a breeze

We love using **Blogstomp**! This amazing software has saved us thousands of hours on blogging. Possibly more. It's helped us get our lives back and makes our blog look streamlined!

EIGHT.

Save space and time uploading

Our favorite? **JPEGmini**! This saves us tons of space on our hard drives and our photo sharing sites without reducing quality in images. It also speeds up the time it takes to upload your photos to your photo sharing site.

NINE.

Plan out your Instagram

To keep our Instagram consistent, we use **Planoly**. This AP helps us plan our instagram content and keeps it looking streamlined and cohesive.



TEN.

Outsource when possible

Outsourcing and asking for help is essential to surviving. Back when we photographed 37+ weddings per year we learned a lot about what we LOVED to do in our business and a lot about what we DIDN'T LOVE SO MUCH.
